- Uses both a regional and sectorial approach




SA Adaptation Framework - draft

- Encourages a bottom up approach






Adaptation Framework

Regional Approach




- Adaptation requires cooperation across sectors in a region
- Encourage cooperation by regional leaders
- Integrates environmental, social and economic leaders
- Helps communities identify and articulate issues and benefits
- Creates a mechanism to influence state policy
- Creates a better understanding within the community
- Identifies specific gaps in knowledge where more research is required
